Winter Abroad at Yonsei

In the winter of 2013, Yonsei University opened its doors for the first time to international students for a 6-week winter program at its Sinchon campus. From 2019-2020, Yonsei University offers a 5-week winter program at our Sinchon campus for international students who would like to enjoy the winter in Seoul. Winter Abroad at Yonse is composed of two separate sessions: Session 1 is a 3-week program focusing on academic achievement with various courses and Session 2 is a 2-week program with an intensive Korean language course along with distinguished cultural and historical lectures related to Korean society. However, this year, to prevent the spread of the COVID-19, Yonsei University made a difficult decision to cancel Session 2. We provide an excellent opportunity to enhance your scholarship, to interact with eminent professors, and to enjoy the companionship of participants from all over the world.

Academic Regulations

Attendance

Yonsei University has a strict attendance policy: any student who is absent from a course for more than 1/3 of the session will be issued an "F" regardless of their achievement in the course. Absences will be counted from the first day of classes.

Some professors, however, may have stricter rules. Please check the course syllabus or ask your professor to find out about the attendance policy for your courses.

All students are expected to attend the classes from the first day of the program until the end of the final exam period.

Course load

Minimum 3 credits / Maximum: 9 credits

In order to complete a full semester's work in only three weeks, WAY courses are highly intensive and fast-paced. Classes meet for 150 minutes each day, five days a week (Mon – Fri), for 3 weeks (45 in-class hours per course). Course requirements include a midterm examination, a final examination, and often a term paper, although the choice remains up to individual professors.


Course Availability

A course will be cancelled if less than five international students register for the WAY courses. Winter Abroad at Yonsei course will cancelled if there are less than 5 international students enrolled. Yonsei Winter Session course will be cancelled if there are less than 20 students enrolled. In the event that your class is cancelled, consult the WAY program manager immediately in regard to alternate course registration at iwinter@yonsei.ac.kr.

Prerequisites

Some courses list prerequisites in their syllabus. Students are required to check if they are eligible for the class or not. WAY students should assess their background of the listed prerequisites. If you are not sure, contact the faculty for advice, or request an exception to the listed prerequisite at the first class meeting. Students should have another course in mind as a backup, because permission for an exception may not be granted.

Course Code



The first three alphabets show which department the course is being offered from. For example, a course code starting with ECO means the course is offered by The Department of Economics. Among the four numbers that follow, the first number shows the targeted year of the course. (For example: IEE2054)

- 1 Freshman course / General course / Lower Division course

Auditing

WAY does not allow students to audit lectures.

Please note that the office will not issue course enrollment confirmations. Students must refer to their account information to confirm and finalize their course registration.

Grading Policy

Final grade assessment is based on attendance, class participation, assignments and examinations. Grades are issued on an "A+, A0 and A-" to "F" scale and will be recorded permanently. All WAY courses will be graded on an absolute evaluation basis.

After the online Grade Check and Correction period, changing grades is not permitted under any circumstances.

Program Withdrawal

Students wishing to withdraw from the program must submit a "Program Withdrawal Form" to the WAY office by January 7th, 2021, 5 PM. Refund will be proceeded according to the refund policy. Please note that we strictly follow our refund policy (available on our website) and the refund should be requested within each deadline.

Students who stop attending classes without submitting the form will receive an "F" for all

of their courses. After this date, grades will be issued regardless of a student's performance.

If you withdraw from the program, a transcript will not be issued. Students also lose their occupancy in the on-campus housing, and they must return their student ID card. If a student awarded a Yonsei scholarship withdraws from the program, the scholarship will be cancelled.

Students can check their grades online at the Portal System(<u>portal.yonsei.ac.kr</u>), during the given period. <u>Only</u> students who have completed the course evaluation can check <u>their grades</u>. Students should contact their professors directly if there is anything wrong about their grades. Grade corrections are **only** possible during the given period.

Transcripts

1 eletronic transcript will be sent directly to the officer/ staff's email address of your university approximately four weeks after the completion of the program. Additional copies of transcripts can be requested for a fee from the WAY website (https://winter.yonsei.ac.kr/main/contents.asp?mid=m04 09).

For courier service, students should pay an additional fee of KRW 25,000.

It is the student's responsibility to check their provided email, university address on their online application form if they are correct before the program ends.

Additional Transcript Request

When students go back home after the completion of the program, they can request additional transcripts on the WAY website. All requests must include the student's name, date of birth, telephone number and mailing address. It is the student's responsibility to provide an accurate address of the place where the transcript should be sent. There is a fee required for each transcript requested.

How to get your textbook or course packet

Students are strongly recommended to purchase their textbooks and references after checking the notice about textbook availability at the WAY website before classes start. But some professors announce that they will use the course packets throughout the course, and you will be able to download it from YSCEC.

Dismissal

Students are expected to be responsible, honest and considerate of others. Please note that using lectures or other instructional materials for commercial purposes and defacing university property is strictly prohibited. Any behavior disturbing orderly academic functions and processes will not be accepted.

Please be advised that Yonsei University has the right to dismiss any student who is deemed detrimental to the program. In the event of a withdrawal for any reason prior to, or during the program, no refund is possible if students fail to maintain adequate academic standards or if their behavior is not in keeping with university standards or the laws of Korea, such as illegal drugs and illegal employment. Any academic regulations not stated here will follow those of Yonsei University.

Facilities and Service Centers

Libraries

The Yonsei University Library was founded in 1915 with the founding of Yonhi College, and was first housed in the building of YMCA in Chong-no Street. In April 1924, the Library moved to the third floor of Yonhi Student Union Building, to the Gwangbok building in June 1956, and then to the Yongjae building in November 1957. On March 30, 1979, the new library building (now Yonsei Central Library) was completed and it has been used as the main library of Yonsei University until 2008.

In 2009, the Library introduced a new academic information system which integrates the decentralized academic information systems of Yonsei University Campus. It is a future-oriented information system preparing for the effective central management of the library systems in Yonsei Songdo Global Academic Complex. The information system is Unicode-based and provides multilingual support in interface languages. In addition, with its standard-based design, the University can interact with international universities more easily and exchange scholarly resources with them.

The Library's collections total more than 2.2 million printed works and 17,000 serials. A variety of electronic resources, including 200 academic databases, 71,500 e-journals, and 476,000 e-books can be accessed both on and off-campus. Yonsei University Library has been the center of Yonsei University's growth, where a variety of academic information is developed, obtained, and preserved so that it can strongly support the education, research and learning activities of all Yonsei University members. With all these achievements, the Library is developing into a leading academic information resource center of the 21st century and is playing a crucial role in making Yonsei University one of the best international research-based universities with the vision of Yonsei 2020.



Health Service Center provides undergraduate, graduate students, and faculty with health services, counseling, and education. The Health Service Center was originally established in 1957 and still serves the university to promote its wellness.

As the primary health care facility of the University, the Center provides diagnosis and prescriptions, trauma treatment, hematologic tests, urinalysis, vaccinations, chest x-rays, and electrocardiograms, as well as dental hygiene services. The Center also provides annual physical examinations for students and faculty. The Center is located on the second floor of the Student Union Building.

Students can also obtain medicine through the pharmacy located at the Student Health Center. Just present your student identification card to purchase medicine at a discount.

Post Office

The on-campus Post Office is located on the Basement of the Student Union Building, and it is open from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm (4:30 pm for finance operations). It is closed on the weekends.

* Regular International Mail Service

Sealed letters below 10g are charged KRW 500~630 and an additional KRW 40~90 for each 10g. Air parcels up to 500g are charged KRW 12,200~19,700 and an additional KRW 1,200~5,100 for each 5g depending on the distance. Surface parcels up to 2kg are charged KRW 10,800~14,100 and an additional KRW 3,300~5,400 for each 2kg. Please note that when you send general international parcels to the USA or Canada, you should have the package insured in order to verify whether it has been delivered. The basic insurance rate is KRW 1,800.

* Express Mail Service (EMS)

EMS is a fast and safe way to send letters, documents, and parcels overseas insured by the Korean government. Parcels containing documents cost KRW 10,200~17,900 if below 300g and KRW 11,800~20,500 for up to 500g. Additional KRW 2,300~7,100 will be charged for each 500g depending on the distance (zones). Non-documents up to 500g cost KRW 15,500~24,800 and additional KRW 1,600~8,700 for each 500g. EMS Premium rates are higher. It will take 3~4 days to reach destinations with direct flights from Seoul. After sending your mail or parcels using the EMS service, you can check the delivery status at the following website: www.koreapost.go.kr/ or service.epost.go.kr/.

Money Matters

The Korean currency is called the "Won." It is issued in 1,000, 5,000, 10,000, 50,000 won bills; and in 10, 50, 100, and 500 won coins. In Korea, personal checks are not used. Special bank checks called Supyo are common. They come in denominations of 100,000 won or higher. Supyos are issued by Korean banks and can be used as cash. When using a Supyo, you will need to show a picture ID card and write down your personal information such as your contact number and address.

It is very difficult to cash U.S. personal checks in Korea because they are not used as a form of money in Korea. It can take up to three months to clear. Major credit cards, including Visa, MasterCard, and American Express are widely accepted in most restaurants and stores in Seoul. If you have a domestic bank, they may charge you an international fee when using your credit card abroad. It is recommended that students bring either traveler's checks or a lump-sum amount in a security instrument such as a cashier's check or international money order.

Banking

Opening a bank account is quite easy. All you need is a certificate of enrollment (issued by the Office of International Affairs) valid passport, or a foreigner registration card. There is no required initial deposit or a fee to open an account. Please note that you must know your local address and phone number. With a bank account is opened, you can receive bank transfers directly into your account. For your convenience, you can also open a dollar bank account that keeps your balance in dollars.

Most international faculties at Yonsei open accounts at Woori Bank (for Information in English: Press 1588-5000 and press 7), because it has a number of ATMs and branches on campus. Opening an account can be done right away and there are staffs who can speak English.

There are two branches of Woori Bank on campus:

Student Union Building (Map #207) Yonsei Alumni Center (Map #016)

Please note that the branch offices are open $09:00 \sim 16:00$ on weekdays and are closed on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. There are ATMs stationed in most university buildings.

Communication

Making Phone Calls

Domestic Calls - When making phone calls to places within Seoul, you do not need to include the area code. Area codes are necessary only when dialing out of Seoul into other provinces in Korea. Calls from a cell phone must always include the area codes.

City & Provincial Area Codes – Provinces and large cities have their own area codes. South Korea's country code is 82. Please exclude the first zero if calling from outside Korea.

Getting a Cellular Phone

To subscribe to mobile phone service, you should select a provider. The main providers in Korea are SK Telecom, LG Uplus, and KT. They provide differing service plans according to customers' various lifestyles, so you can choose an inexpensive service plan that meets your needs. You can pay for the service through various methods including money transfer, credit card, CD/ATM, GIRO, online payment, online remittance.

You can easily purchase a phone at the cell phone stores and you need to provide documents including passport and/ or a foreign registration card.

Transportation

Seoul is one of the largest metropolises in the world with a population of over ten million people. Due to the dense population, traffic congestion is a serious problem in Seoul. However, a systematic, advanced public transportation system provides convenience and helps alleviate this congestion.

Transit Cards

The simplest way of paying for transportation in Seoul is using a T-money transit card which can be used for buses, subways, and most taxis. A T-money card is a prepaid, rechargeable card and can be purchased at ticket windows or convenience store (CU, By the Way, GS 25, 7-11, etc). Using a T-money card is more convenient and saves money since you can get the discount and convenient transfer from subway to bus, vice versa.

Whenever you get on the bus, place your card on the electric card reader next to the driver until it beeps. Do not forget to re-scan your card on the machine next to the exit door before you get off the bus for a discount. You have 30 minutes interval to transfer to another bus or subway to benefit from the discount system. The interval is extended to one hour between 21:00 to 07:00.

Subway

The most efficient method of getting around the city is the subway. With eleven lines connecting various parts of the city, Seoul Metro is quite easy to use. The subway operation hours are from 5:30 am to around midnight. The estimated travel time between subway stations is about 2 to 3 minutes. The schedule can vary depending on the line.

The basic fare of 1,250 won is charged for the first 10km, then an additional 100 won is charged every 5 km up to 40 km. When exceeding 40km, an additional fare of 100 won is charged for every 10km.

Intra-City Buses

Four types of buses cover routes connecting every corner of the city: Main Route(Blue), Branch Route(Green), Circulation Route(Yellow) and Metro Route(Red). The buses travel in 5 to 15 minute intervals, but may take longer in busier parts of the city. Schedules vary depending on the bus routes, but most routes start at 4:30 am with the last bus of the day making its round at 1 am.

Taxis

Taxis in Seoul are affordable and therefore a comfortable and convenient way to travel around the city.

* Ilban Taxis

The basic fare for these taxis is 3,800 won for the first 2 km with an increase of 100 won per 132 m. Keep in mind that there is a 20% fare hike from midnight to 4 am.

* International Taxis

International taxis are Seoul's officially designated foreigner taxi service for foreigners who visit or live in Seoul. Customized services, which include assistance for airport use, Seoul tours, and business, as well as guidance for Seoul life, are provided for foreigners. Each taxi is equipped with a card payment system; customers can pay the taxi fare with a credit card (Visa, Master, JCB, Amex) or T-money.

* Deluxe(Mobeom) taxis

These taxis are black with yellow caps. Being considerably more comfortable, these luxury cabs also cost more. The basic fare is 6,500 won for the first 3 km with an increase of 200 won per 151m.

Medical Services

119

For emergency situations, call 119. When calling, your location is automatically identified. The 119 rescue team will react quickly to meet the caller's needs, offering professional medical assistance such as sending an ambulance and taking patients to the nearest hospital. The 119 ambulance is free of charge. When a foreigner calls 119, the staff in the situation room connects the call with a translator of the Korea National Tourism Organization (KNTO). Through a three-way call with the translator and the staff member in the situation room, the foreign caller can effectively communicate his/her needs and obtain assistance.

Pharmacies

There are many pharmacies throughout Seoul, so it should be easy to spot a pharmacy with the Korean sign of "약" or "약국" in your neighborhood. Korean pharmacies sell both prescribed and over-the-counter medications. Medicines that can be purchased at pharmacies without a prescription include digestives, nutrients, vitamins, aminopyrine, and some cold medicines.

Severance Hospital

Severance Hospital is the oldest hospital in Korea and has an excellent reputation. This hospital is just minutes away. In pursuit of quality improvement of medical services through the specialization of medical examinations and treatments for the first time in Korea, Severance Hospital manages the Cancer Center, Rehabilitation Hospital, Cardiovascular Hospital, Eye and ENT Hospital, Child and Adolescent Clinic, Emergency Care Center, Diabetes Center, Allergy Clinic, and Stroke Intensive Care Unit.

Severance Hospital maintains an International Health Care Center. The center is staffed by doctors and nurses who are fluent in several languages, including English, Japanese, and Chinese, and are ready to serve the medical needs of foreigners in Korea.
